> Congressional Briefing Sept. 9, 2014

- 1. The Illinois CPP must not cause or perpetuate significant, adverse, and disproportionate environmental consequences in EJ communities.
- 2. Illinois must provide a full and complete opportunity for EJ Stakeholders to participate in the development and implementation of its Clean Power Plan.
- 3. The Illinois CPP must ensure equal Access to benefits, for example, residential energy efficiency and renewable energy programs.
- 4. Environmental benefits achieved in Illinois must not be at the expense of EJ communities in other states.
- 5. Illinoi should prioritize some reduction alternatives over others, with the highest priority given to energy conservation and efficiency, renewable energy and the permanent retirement of coal-fired power plants.
- 6. Illinois should assign lower priority to fuel-switching to natural gas, nuclear energy, and more efficient coal combustion because of the total environmental burdens created by these categories as sources.
